Purpose of Organization – More Examples: (Try and be descriptive of your program – include any age or max. number limits and project requirements if any.)

These are just EXAMPLES. Project, age requirements or other limits are not required.

Teach life skills to youth through participation in Horse activities as the primary project. Other project areas such as crafts and leadership will depend on availability of project leaders. Members must be enrolled by April 1 to compete but will be accepted through June if enrollment cap of 15 members not met.

Teach plant science, responsibility, planning and nutrition through gardening & foods projects to K – 5th grade youth. Program will run April thru August.

Provide positive activities in an after-school 4-H club for 1st - 7th grade youth at the MyTown School. Hands-on fun activities from multiple project areas will incorporate math, science, reading and communication skills. The program will run twice a month, Oct. - June.

To teach youth how to raise and care for market livestock, therefore teaching them responsibility, compassion and how to work with others.
